- 1. Prejudice gets in the way of the truth.
- 2. Getting to the bottom of a complex issue takes time and effort.
- 3. It takes a great deal of courage to stand alone.
- 4. Justice is a fragile and triumphant state.
- 5. Check your intuitions neither dismiss them, nor trust them blindly.
- 6. There are many interpretations of "the fact".
- 7. Test others' opinions, question their assumptions, and draw your own conclusions.
